TAKE AWAY

Choices

John 3:16 For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. 17 God sent his Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through him.18 There is no judgment against anyone who believes in him. But anyone who does not believe in him has already been judged for not believing in God's one and only Son. John 8:24 (Jesus says:) You will die in your sins; for unless you believe that I am who I claim to be, you will die in your sins. Acts 16:31 Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved.

Jeremiah 17:9 The human heart is the most deceitful of all things, and desperately wicked. 4:23 Guard your heart above all else, for it determines the course of your life.

21:2 People may be right in their own eyes, but the Lord examines their heart.

23:26 O my son, give me your heart. May your eyes take delight in following my ways.

you! Write them deep within your heart. Then you will find favor with both God and people and you will earn a good reputation.

Galatians 6:7-8 Don't be misled—you cannot mock the justice of God. You will always harvest what you plant. 8 Those who live only to satisfy their own sinful nature will harvest decay and death from that sinful nature. But those who live to please the Spirit will harvest everlasting life from the Spirit. 3:33 The Lord curses the house of the wicked, but he blesses the home of the upright.

Wisdom: God-given understanding, ability to distinguish between right and wrong, insight, discernment. The ability to look at life from God's point of view and then choosing to live it out through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Fear of the Lord: profound reverence and awe toward God; respect for God's character, words, actions and position that leads to love and obedience; true honor, devotion and surrender to God.
