God as Creator and Sustainer

- 5. Who created the earth and everything in it? Genesis 1:1
- 6. Read Psalm 33: 6-7. God organized everything perfectly when He created the heavens and the earth. What does this tell you about God?
- 7. What does God tell us in Isaiah 46:10 about the future?













- 8. What does Psalm 18:30 say about God's way and His promises? What does this mean in your life?
- 9. God is all-powerful and all-knowing, How do we know this based on Psalm 147:5 and Isaiah 40:28?
- 10. How does learning about God's character impact you? How should we respond? (See memory verse for one of many ways.)

Who Is God?

Who Is Jesus?

The first four books of the New Testament, are called the gospels which means "good news." They tell about Jesus' birth, early life, and His teachings, miracles, ministry, death, and resurrection (rise from death).

- 1. What did the Bible foretell about Jesus before He came to earth? Isaiah 9:6
- 2. Read John 1:18, John 10:30 and John 1:14. Jesus is both completely God and completely human. How do we know that from these verses? What do you think this means?
- 3. Read John 3:16-17. Who sent Jesus to earth and why?
- 4. What does John 1:29 and Revelation 17:14 tell us who Jesus is?



Jesus' Life on Earth

- 5. According to Matthew 15:31 and Mark 10:45, what did Jesus do during His time on earth and what was His purpose?
- 6. What was Jesus' main teaching? Matthew 22:37-39
 We cannot keep these commandments on our own, so we need a Savior Jesus.
- 7. What did Jesus tell his disciples would happen to Him? Luke 18:31-33

























- 8. Read 1 Peter 3:18. Why did He have to die? Why is it important that Jesus never sinned?
- 9. According to Romans 6:9, what is the result of Jesus being raised from the dead? What does this mean?

These three words—Christ conquered death—define the most important difference between Christianity and all other religions. Because of Jesus' death and resurrection, we are invited into a relationship with Him. Lesson 6 will cover how we can have this relationship.

10. "Christ is risen." Where is Jesus today? What is He doing? See 1 Peter 3:22 and John 14:1-3.

BELIEVE THE TRUTH

Jesus Christ is a real person recorded in history. The Bible tells us exactly who He was: the Son of God sent to earth in human form to die for our sins. He rose from the dead, beating sin and death and offers us a new life in Him. Can you believe that God would do this for YOU?!

PRAY THE TRUTH

Jesus, I believe You are Son of God. Thank you for coming to show us what God is like and to show us the one and only way to the Father. Thank you for showing us what is Truth. Thank you for dying on the cross for all sinners. Please help me to see all that You did for me and my need for You. All praise and glory to You. Amen.

Who Is Jesus?

Isaiah 9:6: For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

John 1:18: "No one has ever seen God. But the unique One (Jesus), who is himself God, is near to the Father's heart. He has revealed God to us."

1 Peter 3:22: "Now Christ has gone to heaven. He is seated in the place of honor next to God, and all the angels and authorities and powers accept his authority."

- 9. What does the Holy Spirit want to produce in our lives instead? Galatians 5:22-23
- 10. The power of the Holy Spirit is really hard to wrap our minds around. 2 Timothy 1:7 says, "For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline." What does this verse tell you that the Holy Spirit wants for us?

BELIEVE THE TRUTH

The Holy Spirit is God in Spirit form. God gives us Himself - the Holy Spirit - to be our Teacher, Helper, Counselor, Comforter, Guide, and Friend. The Holy Spirit is the bridge between us sinful humans and a glorious, perfect, sinless God. Praise God that by giving us His Spirit, we can have a relationship with God and have the power and help to overcome sin. May you accept this gift, and may your heart of stone be changed to a heart after Christ!

PRAY THE TRUTH

Dear God, thank you for giving Your Spirit to live in all believers! May the Holy Spirit help me to follow You more closely. I pray that You would produce in me love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Amen.

Who is the Holy Spirit?

Holy Spirit: God's Spirit. Called Advocate. Lives within all Christians as our helper, teacher, comforter, and our friend. Holy Spirit wants to lead us and guide us every day.

Truth: God's Word is truth. It comes from God and can be trusted; genuine; honest; reliable.

John 14:16-17a: "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, who will never leave you. He is the Holy Spirit, who leads into all truth."

Holy Spirit in Our Lives

Acts 2:38: Peter replied, "Each of you must repent of your sins and turn to God, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Ephesians 1:13-14: "And now you Gentiles have also heard the truth, the Good News that God saves you. And when you believed in Christ, he identified you as his own by giving you the Holy Spirit, whom he promised long ago. What is the Bible?

The Bible is God's message to us. God made sure that everything we need to know is in His Word. This book gives us the opportunity to see and know God and His plan and purposes for man and the world. It helps us know how to live our lives and to honor God.

Romans 15:4: "Such things were written in the Scriptures long ago to teach us. And the Scriptures give us hope and encouragement as we wait patiently for God's promises to be fulfilled."

The Bible contains 66 books and was written by more than 40 authors over a period of roughly 1,500 years. It has two sections all with one message - all inspired by God. The Old Testament begins with the creation of the universe and the creation of man. Throughout the Old Testament, God asks His people to obey His laws, but His people disobey him. Despite this disobedience, God promised to make a way for all things to be right again. The New Testament tells us how this promise that God made came true. The New Testament is all about the birth, life, teachings, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ - our Savior. God who is holy and righteous shows grace toward sinners by sending Jesus to save us!

2 Peter 1:20-21: "Above all, you must realize that no prophecy in Scripture ever came from the prophet's own understanding, or from human initiative. No, those prophets were moved by the Holy Spirit, and they spoke from God."



The Bible Reveals and Teaches

2 Timothy 3:16: "All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right."

Hebrews 4:12-13: "For the word of God is alive and powerful. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow. It exposes our innermost thoughts and desires. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God. Everything is naked and exposed before his eyes, and he is the one to whom we are accountable."

Proverbs 4:20-22: "My child, pay attention to what I say. Listen carefully to my words. Don't lose sight of them. Let them penetrate deep into your heart, for they bring life to those who find them, and healing to their whole body."

Ephesians 2:1-3 Us Without Jesus

The Apostle Paul wrote a letter to the Christians in Ephesus. In this passage, Paul reminds the people what they were like before they became followers of Christ.

- 1. How does Paul describe the Ephesians without Jesus?
- 2. See the definition of sin. Describe sin in your own words. According to verse 2, who is the Devil (Satan) and what does he do?
- 3. What do you think it means to follow the world? How does Satan (Devil) use media to influence people?



Ephesians 2:4-5 The Grace of God

- 4. What did God do for us and WHY? vv. 4-5
- 5. Review the definition of grace. What do you think "It is only by God's grace that you have been saved!" means? Is there any other way a person can be made alive (saved) apart from Jesus? Why?
- 6. God sent His Son to save us sinners BEFORE we started following Him. That's how much He loves us! Do you ever feel like you don't deserve God's love? How does this passage encourage you?

























- 7. Review definition of salvation. Why can't we "take credit" for our salvation? v. 8
- 8. Saving is all God's idea and all His work. It's God's gift from start finish! What is our role? v. 8
- 9. Do you think a person can do enough good things to get to heaven? Why? v. 9
- 10. Even though salvation is entirely by the grace of God and "not a reward for the good things we have done," how do our actions and the way we live matter?
 v. 10

BELIEVE THE TRUTH

The Bible tells us that we ALL sin and fall short of the Glory of God. No one is perfect and we all need Jesus. But praise God, He sent His Son to earth to live a sinless life, die on the cross for OUR SINS, and be raised from the dead. Jesus conquered sin and death so that we may have life! And all we have to do is believe! THAT is called amazing grace! What a merciful, loving God! Do you believe?

PRAY THE TRUTH

Prayer if God leads you...

God loves you just the way you are. But He loves you too much to leave you just the way you are! What is God revealing to you through this lesson?















Ephesians 2:1-10 (NLT)

Made Alive with Christ

1 Once you were dead because of your disobedience and your many sins. 2 You used to live in sin, just like the rest of the world, obeying the devil—the commander of the powers in the unseen world. He is the spirit at work in the hearts of those who refuse to obey God. 3 All of us used to live that way, following the passionate desires and inclinations of our sinful nature. By our very nature we were subject to God's anger, just like everyone else.

4 But God is so rich in mercy, and he loved us so much, 5 that even though we were dead because of our sins, he gave us life when he raised Christ from the dead. (It is only by God's grace that you have been saved!)

6 For he raised us from the dead along with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms because we are united with Christ Jesus. 7 So God can point to us in all future ages as examples of the incredible wealth of his grace and kindness toward us, as shown in all he has done for us who are united with Christ Jesus.

8 God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. 9 Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it. 10 For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago.

Sin: any action or attitude that falls short of God's perfect standard; separates us from a holy God. When we sin we show contempt for God. Sin keeps the world from working as God originally intended it to.

Grace: God's free and undeserved love toward sinful humans that never ends. A gift that not only forgets our sins but also makes us whole.

Salvation: rescued or delivered from the penalty and power of sin in your life because you believe that Jesus, God's Son, came to earth and died on the cross to pay the penalty for your sins. He was resurrected to life to save all who trust in Him.

























The Lord's Prayer



MEMORY VERSE: "I am praying to you because I know you will answer, O God. Bend down and listen as I pray." Psalm 17:6



Matthew 6:9-10 Praying to Our Father in Heaven

Through the gift of prayer we are able to talk to God. God is with us and ready to listen. We can pray, at any time and in any place, but there are some areas of prayer and attitudes towards prayer that are important to know. Jesus gives us this example for how to pray.

- 1. Read verse 9. Why is this the first line of the prayer? How are our prayers affected by who we think God is and what He is like? How can we keep His Name holy?
- 2. Read verse 10. Jesus has come but He will come again. What do you think God wants us to be doing until that time comes?
- 3. When you pray for God's will to be done in the world and in your life do you know what that means? What do you think it looks like for God's will to be done in your life?



Matthew 6:11-12 Praying for Our Needs and Forgiveness

- 4. Read verse 11. This line is praying for what we need. What kinds of things do you regularly ask God for? Why does the Lord's Prayer only focus on asking for "daily" bread?

- 6. Verse 11 convicts us to be as forgiving to others as we want God to be with us. Do you forgive others as freely and generously as God forgives you?

- 7. Read verse 13. What particular trials/temptations/tests are you going through at the moment? What help do we need to overcome them?
- 8. Jesus' death on the cross defeated Satan, but until Jesus returns there are still some battles to be fought. How do you think prayer impacts evil and the evil one (Satan)?
- 9. Do your prayers reflect the model that Jesus gave us? What have you learned about prayer by studying the Lord's Prayer? How can you put that into practice into the future?

BELIEVE THE TRUTH

The Lord's Prayer not only teaches us how to pray like Jesus by giving us words to say, but it also leads us into a rich and meaningful way of talking to and hearing from the Lord. Ephesians 6:10-18 (NLT)

The Whole Armor of God

10 A final word: Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. 11 Put on all of God's armor so that you will be able to stand firm against all strategies of the devil. 12 For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places.

13 Therefore, put on every piece of God's armor so you will be able to resist the enemy in the time of evil. Then after the battle you will still be standing firm. 14 Stand your ground, putting on the belt of truth and the body armor of God's righteousness. 15 For shoes, put on the peace that comes from the Good News so that you will be fully prepared. 16 In addition to all of these, hold up the shield of faith to stop the fiery arrows of the devil. 17 Put on salvation as your helmet, and take the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

18 Pray in the Spirit at all times and on every occasion. Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers for all believers everywhere.

Satan: God's enemy; powerful angel who rebelled against God and was cast out of heaven; tempts people to sin.

Righteousness: being in a right relationship with God, without guilt or sin. God declares believers not quilty/righteous because righteousness of their faith in Jesus.

Good News: is the Gospel. It is the message that God sent His Son Jesus to take away our sins by dying on the cross and resurrecting to life again to save all who trust in Him.

Galatians 5:16-26 (NLT)

16 So I say, let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves. 17 The sinful nature wants to do evil, which is just the opposite of what the Spirit wants. And the Spirit gives us desires that are the opposite of what the sinful nature desires. These two forces are constantly fighting each other, so you are not free to carry out your good intentions. 18 But when you are directed by the Spirit, you are not under obligation to the law of Moses.

19 When you follow the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: sexual immorality, impurity, lustful pleasures, 20 idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, 21 envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will not inherit the Kingdom of God.

22 But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!"

24 Those who belong to Christ Jesus have nailed the passions and desires of their sinful nature to his cross and crucified them there. 25 Since we are living by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit's leading in every part of our lives. 26 Let us not become conceited, or provoke one another, or be jealous of one another.
