IN TRUTH Esther



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Esther shows us two kinds of people: the proud and the humble. Two verses that sum this up: First, Proverbs 16:18 says, "Pride goes before destruction, and haughtiness before a fall." This is a perfect verse for Haman. The other verse is James 4:10, which says, "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will lift you up in honor." This verse is perfect for Esther and Mordecai.

Mordecai named the festival celebrating the Jews victory after what Haman did - casting lots (The Festival of Purim). The item used by Haman to make a decision about when to annihilate the Jews, now becomes the symbol for God's deliverance. What the world uses, God can turn for His own purposes.

Esther closes by telling us that Mordecai was now second in command, and was held in high esteem... "continuing to work for the good of his people and to speak up for the welfare of all their descendants." (10:3)

So who are you, Haman or Mordecai and Esther?

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
